

See how Adobe apps integrate with other essential classroom tools.

Adobe is making it easy for educators and students to access their creative tools and projects from popular learning management systems and other productivity apps.

Discover all the ways that Adobe Creative Cloud and Adobe Express integrate with the tools you use every day:

Send files directly from Adobe Express to Google Classroom and Google Drive.

Students and educators who use both Adobe Express and Google Classroom can now skip the file download and upload process and send files to Google Classroom—no need to create public sharing links.

Adobe Express is also available in the Google marketplace. After installation, students can send projects right from Adobe Express to their Google Drives using a new option in the Publish menu. And they can double-click projects in their Adobe Express Google Drive folders to open them inside the Adobe Express Editor and make changes. Students can also start new Adobe Express creations from within Google Drive using the Create button.

Embed Adobe Express projects in Microsoft OneNote and share them to Microsoft Teams.

Students can now embed Adobe Express projects inside their OneNote notebooks to share with their educators and peers. And educators can embed Adobe Express graphics and videos into OneNote to share with students.

Students and educators can also share Adobe Express projects directly to a Microsoft Teams classroom. Educators or other students can access their creations immediately in Teams, with no need to use email or download files.

In addition, educators can add an Adobe Express or Creative Cloud tab in their Teams channel. This is a great way to keep track of important projects for the whole class.

Access Adobe apps through the Canvas learning management system.

At schools that have Canvas and Adobe Express, everyone can access Adobe Express from right inside Canvas with the power of Single Sign-On. Educators can create assignments and send them through Canvas, students can open and complete the assignments in Adobe Express online and then submit them, and educators can view and comment in Canvas SpeedGrader. Also, educators and students who have access to Creative Cloud can launch their Creative Cloud apps through Canvas with Single Sign-On. They can see which apps are available to them and start creating.

Launch Creative Cloud from inside the Blackboard learning management system.

Educators and students who use Blackboard Learn can now click “Creative Cloud” in the Course Content feed to access apps like Adobe Photoshop, Illustrator, Premiere Pro, and more. With the power of Single Sign-On, they’ll be automatically logged in to their Creative Cloud account.

Access Adobe Express directly from Clever.

Students who use Clever no longer need to remember a separate username and password for Adobe Express. Thanks to Single Sign-On, they can simply log in to their Clever portals, click the Adobe Express tile, and begin creating graphics, web pages, videos, and more.

Open Adobe Express from ClassLink.

IT administrators can find Adobe Express in ClassLink’s library of EdTech applications and add it to their Management Consoles. Then, educators and students can seamlessly log in to their LaunchPads with the ease and power of Single Sign-On, click the Adobe Express tile, and start creating.

View Adobe Express videos inside Flipgrid.

Until recently, educators could only add static thumbnails of Adobe Express videos to the Flipgrid Focus area, and students had to leave Flipgrid to watch the videos. Now, educators and students can play full Adobe Express videos right inside the Focus area. Teachers can also include Adobe Express videos as a media attachment in a Topic, making it even easier for educators and students to communicate visually.

Embed Adobe Express projects within a Wakelet collection.

Enhance your Wakelet collection with your favorite Adobe Express projects. You can now embed your Adobe Express projects into your Wakelet collection directly from Wakelet. Simply click “Adobe Express” on the Wakelet app drop-down and choose the project you want to add. From within Adobe Express, you can also grab the project URL and embed it into your Wakelet collection and your creation will instantly unfurl.

Beautify your book in Book Creator with Adobe Express.

Educators and students can use Book Creator to build interactive multimedia books by combining text, audio, video, and images. Now you can embed Adobe Express projects directly into the pages of your book just by adding in the project URL.
